The Mustard Seed shelter is available to individuals seeking a safe space to sleep at night with other guests who are experiencing sobriety. The shelter has capacity for up to 46 adults during the winter months, and 35 adults for the remainder of the year.

Additionally, The Mustard Seed School Lunch Program ensures youth experiencing poverty receive a healthy and nutritious lunch throughout the school year. The program makes and delivers approximately 350 meals daily to low-income students.

Our actors and technicians put in a tremendous amount of work to get this show ready, and they all deserve a huge round of applause for all of their dedication. There was also an opportunity for some of our participants to take on the roles of assistant stage manager, props design, costume assistant, and light/sound board operator. Tree House is not just for actors, as we are developing technical theatre programing as well.

Our 9-12 year old participants created *The Witch's Curse*, which is based on the play that the character Jo March writes in Louisa May Alcott's novel *Little Women*. They took the source material, and expanded upon it, to create their own one-act play, which will open before our production of *Little Women*. For many of these young actors, this is their first experience of ever being in a play. It has truly been an honour to work with them, and I look forward to seeing their theatre careers grow.

An enormous thank you to our volunteers for this production. We have a staggering 32 (and counting) volunteers working on this production and for our casino fundraiser. 
